From the Pastor...

June brings with it a number of changes as we move from the end of the church program year to our summer schedules and activities. Some of those changes have already started. From Pastor Rosanna...

COMMISSIONER TO THE GENERAL ASSEMBLY

"Do not conform any longer to the pattern of this world, but be transformed by the renewing of your mind. Then you will be able to test and approve what God's will is—his good, pleasing and perfect will. For by the grace given me I say to every one of you: do not think of yourself more highly than you ought, but rather think of yourself with sober judgment, in accordance with the measure of faith God has given you." (Romans 12:2-3)

Gathered on a bright Sunday morning at the outdoor chapel overlooking the lake at Camp Johnsonburg, I contemplated this passage with about a hundred middle school students and youth leaders from the seven presbyteries of New Jersey. We were at a spring retreat on the theme "Connected 24/7." Our thoughtful and dynamic speaker for the weekend highlighted these verses in our concluding worship service. We had enjoyed a wonderful retreat with meaningful discussions, fun games, a beautiful hike, inspiring music and plenty of laughter. After worship, our group of a dozen would soon return to Cranbury and move on to our next endeavors. But during the sermon we were asked to think seriously about how we'd live back home in ways that honor God and foster authentic connections with him and with others. Somehow in that moment the phrase "sober judgment" struck a chord with me in this familiar passage. I felt God was speaking directly to me as I considered a major inter-generational Presbyterian gathering I will participate in this summer, General Assembly. As one student in my small group reminded us, Spider-Man's Uncle Ben told Peter Parker, "with great power comes great responsibility" (written by Stan Lee). I'm only one person voting, but I'll need to do my homework diligently and let God faithfully renew my mind.

Monmouth Presbytery elected me a commissioner to the 219th General Assembly, the highest governing body of the Presbyterian Church (USA). This General Assembly, or G.A., will take place on July 3-10, 2010 in Minneapolis. Elders Joel Davies and Susan Ritacco and pastor Rob Carter and I will represent the 47 churches of our presbytery. We will be among the 712 commissioners from 173 presbyteries of our denomination. We're charged with prayerfully considering "what God's will is- his good, pleasing and perfect will" in response to the overtures (the list of which is eight pages long!) and other business at G.A. We will vote according to our conscience. In addition, Young Adult Advisory Delegate Rebecca Crate will join us as one of 165 YAADs who will have voice and vote during committee work and voice in the G.A. plenary sessions. (Our own Sarah Gordon served as a YAAD at the 218th General Assembly in 2008 in San Jose.) Many very important issues will be addressed. I encourage you to read about them at www.pcusa.org. After G.A., the presbyteries vote in the coming year to determine whether G.A.'s decisions will be ratified. But first, at the May 22 presbytery meeting our delegation will be commissioned and I will also be commissioned by our church in worship

on May 27. Please remember me and all the commissioners in your prayers during June and the first week of July. May we truly seek and serve the Lord's perfect will for his church!

MISSION MATTERS

It is always satisfying to receive a note of thanks from the Princeton Seminary student who is the recipient of our scholarship - Manoj Shrestha, a Ph.D, student studying Practical Theology focusing on Homilectics, has written a most interesting letter, not only expressing his appreciation for this financial aid, but explaining his future plans. He will be returning to Nepal to work on starting a M.Div. at the Nepal Ebenezer Bible College. How far our gifts travel! And we appreciate donations we have received for Skeet's Pantry. We received a note of thanks from TASK for the \$178.00 we recently sent to them.

Mission, Service, and Grants Committee voted to grant Fran Stewart, a nurse attending the Guatemala trip sponsored by the Allentown Church, the necessary ground fee of \$750. This money will come from the Guatemala dinner committed funds of \$6,944.44. The remaining committed funds will be donated to the Allentown Mission Team to purchase medical and building supplies, etc.

Connie Bauder reported that twenty-three persons attended the April 23 trip to the Princeton University Chapel concert and visit to the Princeton Library and on May 4 seventeen persons enjoyed a picnic in Tatum Park and Deep Cut Garden in Middleton. A trip to Allaire State Park and museum is on the calendar for June.

Hunger shows no sign of abating as evidenced by the need for Skeet's Pantry to distribute bags of food to feed around 60 families, 170 people. And we continue to assist at TASK with eight people regularly traveling to Trenton the first Thursday of every month. And while Anne Gordon drives these helpers Gail Geijer kindly covers the office in Anne's stead.

Cranbury Church was listed in a prime spot on the brochure put out by Centurion Ministries. The DVD they have prepared describing their work is both impressive and touching. They were the first to do this work of struggling to release wrongly charged prisoners and the only one that considers prisoners without DNA evidence to support their release.

Pentecost Offering was May 23, and the confirmation class which is heading up this offering request has voted to give our share to Heifer International, always a worthy project.

Legacy Gifting and the Endowment Fund

Legacy gifting is a fine way to support your church that has been here for you over the years. In as much as these legacy gifts find their way into the Endowment Fund, it is important to remind ourselves just how important the Endowment Fund is to our church as we know it.

We have heard a lot about the Rainy Day Fund that the endowment makes available. If it were not for these funds, whether used or not, we would have to seriously reduce spending plans in order to start each year with a balanced budget. That would not be easy!

Second, the Davis Endowment fund provides funds for the cemetery. Churches and cemeteries go together. And cemeteries have to be operated, maintained and at times repaired.

Next, the Endowment Fund provides funds to Buildings and Grounds to fund major and on-going maintenance and repairs of the church buildings. Depending how you count them, our church is housed in six buildings -- six historic buildings that seem to always require attention.

Lastly, but maybe most importantly, the Endowment Fund provides the bulk of the money used by Mission, Service and Grants to carry on mission-focused giving that has been important to our church's outreach to the world.

It is important to remember the Endowment is not consumed. Sometimes the stock market may make it look as if it is being "consumed" but we are very careful about determining the long-term sustainability of our spending from the endowment. This is to assure the long-term sustainability of the fund so future generations may also benefit from this gift.

WALKING IN FAITH

Faith Journey by Charlie III

Throughout my life I have been learning more about God and my religion. There have been many religious events from the time I was baptized up to my confirmation.

Being a Christian means to me that I believe in God and I believe that Jesus is God's Son. Christians should love one another and as Jesus said "Love one another as I have loved you." Jesus didn't even want everyone to love him he just wanted everyone to love one another.

I pray to God to ask him several things. I mostly pray to help other people and to be thankful for what my family and I have. I also pray for myself when I am having a tough time or when I can't figure out how to overcome a problem. I sometimes think about being in a situation where I was poor or without a home.
